EYE, DOROTHY EVANGELINE – 87, Halifax, passed away peacefully at home on October 2, 2011, following a brief illness. Born in Saint John, NB., she was a daughter of the late John and Winnifred Guild. She is survived by daughter, Jane, Nine Mile River; daughter, Barbara and her husband Philip Pineau, Hunter River, PEI; sister, Jean Webber; sisters-in-law Barbara Eye and Joyce Graham; many nieces and nephews. She was predeceased by her husband, George Elliot Eye; brother, Robert Douglas Guild, who was killed in the Second World War and is buried in Idurn Jutland, Denmark. Dorothy graduated from Saint John High School in 1940; worked in Saint John for a few years, then entered the Saint John General Hospital School of Nursing in 1946, graduating in 1949. She worked in Saint John for eight years and moved to Halifax in 1959 when her husband, a member of the RCMP, was transferred there. In 1974, she went on to work at the IWK Hospital for Children, retiring in 1988. She was a member of the choir at Knox Presbyterian Church for over 40 years.
